



The Session approved the following motions and requests:

- Guidelines outlining the Sardis Reopening from the Safety Task Force
- Received Nolan Anderson as an active member
- Personnel Ministry's structure of the staff functions. This will be the basis for the job description for the new position of Minister/Director of Contemporary Worship
- Empowered the Administration Commission to act on behalf of the Session between meetings of Session
- The following motions/statements regarding Anti-racism:
 - A. The Session of Sardis Presbyterian Church recognizes and unequivocally repents of the sin of racism in our past and present. As we recognize God's vision for us to be Exploring Faith and Changing Lives we are committed to a future of listening to and learning from the experiences of others positively, so that our lives might be changed by God in ways that equip us to change the lives of others who suffer personal or systemic racial injustice in any form in our local community, Church, and the world.
 - B. Establishment of an Anti-Racism Task Force charged with making Sardis Presbyterian Church more inclusive and to equip members with information and skills that will allow SPC and its members to make an impact in the world for those who suffer from racial injustice.
- Provide Sardis members an opportunity to sponsor a child in Haiti through World of God
- One half of an estate gift received in May will be used to pay down Sardis' debt. The remaining half will be placed in the General Endowment Fund Principal Account.
