† AFFIRMATION OF FAITH The Nicene Creed (4th Century) Dr. Schaaf We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth. of all that is, seen and unseen. 

JESUS CHRIST: ADVENT



One stanza of this paraphrase of the great O Antiphons may be sung on each of the last days of Advent as follows:

Dec. 17: O Wisdom (2) Dec. 18: O Lord of might (3) Dec. 19: O Root of Jesse (4) Dec. 20: O Key of David (5) Dec. 21: O Dayspring (6) Dec. 22: O Desire of Nations (7) Dec. 23: O Emmanuel (1)


These titles of the coming Christ appeared in daily Vesper antiphons sung during the week before Christmas; their roots date at least to the reign of Charlemagne. Both text and tune are the fruit of 19th-century efforts to reclaim Christian treasures from pre-Reformation sources.

VENI EMMANUEL LM with refrain



Seldom has the wonder of the Incarnation been expressed so beautifully as in this text, created in the era when the Apostles' and Nicene Creeds were being codified and mindful of similar theological affirmations. It is set here to a plainchant melody from the late Middle Ages.

DIVINUM MYSTERIUM 8.7.8.7.8.7.7



Beginning as a paraphrase of Psalm 24:7–10, this text then applies the door imagery to the singer's heart, and concludes with the individual's welcome of the approaching Savior. It is set to a very effective anonymous 18th-century English tune that has served many texts.
